Rules and Regulations

1. Date and Venue

❖ 28th and 29th August 2021 online at NTVS College of Law, Nandurbar

2. Team composition and eligibility criteria

- Each team shall comprise of three (3) members ONLY out of which two (2) will be speakers and one (1) researcher.
- Arguments shall be in English only.
- The competition is open for bonafide students pursuing five year or three years LL.B course.
- Each Law College shall be eligible to participate one team only. Team should not disclose the identity of their institution in course of proceedings in the court rooms; such disclosure shall invite penalties including disqualification.

3. Dress Code

Inside the court room (online) the participant shall follow the below mentioned dress code.

- **Females:** White Salwar Kurta & Dupatta Or White Shirt And Black Trousers Along With Black Coat And Tie.
- **Males:** White Shirt, Black Trousers, Black Tie Along With Black Coat And Black Shoes.

4. Competition Format

Each team shall perform online both sides (petitioner and respondent) of their case in front of judges of this competition.

5. Memorial

- i. All teams must submit Memorials/ Written Submissions for both sides and a college covering page **before 10th August 2021** by email at ntvslawndb@gmail.com
- ii. **The last date to send registration form duly signed is 25th July 2021** by email at ntvslawndb@gmail.com
- iii. All teams must submit typed Memorials for both sides and the Memorials must fulfill all the following specifications;
- iv. Memorials must contain the following:
 - Cover page with Cause title.
 - Index.
 - Index of Authorities.
 - Statement of Jurisdiction.
 - Synopsis of Facts.
 - Summary of Arguments.
 - Arguments / Pleadings.
 - Conclusion / Prayer.
- iv. The Memorial shall be typed on A4 size page in
 - Main content
 - Font type: Times New Roman,
 - Font size : 12,
 - 1.5 line spacing
 - 1 inch margin on each side
 - Foot note
 - Font type: Times New Roman,
 - Font size : 10,
- v. The Memorial must not contain any Annexure/Photographs/Sketches/Exhibits/Affidavits, etc.
- vi. Memorials that do not comply with the abovementioned specifications will not be considered.
- vii. Identification of any type shall attract severe action.
- viii. Arguments shall be in English only.
- ix. **NTVS College of Law, Nandurbar reserves the right to modify the rules if found necessary and they shall be binding on all the teams.**

6. Marking criteria for memorials

- (i) Memorial from each side shall carry total of hundred (100) marks.
- (ii) The following shall be the criteria for marking the memorials:

7. Oral Submissions

- i. Each team shall comprise of two (2) speakers, 1 researcher, as has been specified earlier.
- ii. Court language shall be English only
- iii. Each team will have a maximum of twenty (20) minutes to present their Oral Submissions in competition. No speaker will be permitted to address the Court for more than twelve (12) minutes.
- iv. At the commencement of each session of Oral Submissions each team shall notify the Court Officer as to the division of time between the 2 speakers.
- v. If any speaker continues to speak after the completion of his/her time, he/she shall entail penalty which shall be upon the discretion of the judges.
- vi. During the course of the Oral Submissions no speaker shall reveal his/her identify or the identity of their University / College by any means whatsoever.

8. Marking Criteria for the Arguments:

- (i) Each Speaker will be marked on a total of 100 marks by each Bench Judge.

(ii) The following will be the Marking Criteria and the Marks allocated to each Speaker by each Judge in the Round
